Certain changes have taken place this year to the Copyright, Designs and Patents Act. The result of this is that all churches which play sound recordings on their premises and / or during their activities may, subject to a number of exceptions, need a new PPL Church Licence. CHRISTIAN AID

PHILLIPINES TYPHOON APPEAL

Torrential rains brought by Typhoon Washi caused massive flooding and wide-spread damage to southern areas of the Phillipines—leaving approximately 1000 people dead with the numbers still rising. In Cagayan de Oro City a total of 360,000 people have been affected and are in urgent need of help.

Partner organisations in the Phillipines are already on the ground, assessing the situation and responding. They need your support to provide emergency food, shelter and safe water to those in need.

£15 could buy mosquito nets to protect 4 people against malaria; £30 could buy hygiene kits for 10 people to prevent the spread of disease; £45 could buy 24 blankets to keep families warm at night.

"In times of disaster, the poorest families are generally the worst affected. They tend to live in the riskiest areas and their modest homes are least able to withstand powerful winds and surging floodwaters," said Ramani Leathard, Christian Aid's South East Asia Regional Manager.
